# Approval of Minutes of June 21, 2023 Council Meeting:

Mr. Hankins moved and Mr. Vaughan seconded to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report:

**June/July:** Mr. Miles stated that he reviewed the financial report and found everything to be in order. Mr. Hankins moved and Mr. Walker seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Motion carried.

#### Report of Officers, Committees & Executive Director:

**Chairman's Report**: There was none.

**Executive Director Monthly Activities Report:** Ms. Foster stated that a report was included in the Council packet. She stated that instead of going through the report, she would like to present a PowerPoint presentation that she created as a flashback through the CRC's history to commemorate the CRC's most recent move into the Heartland Building in Keysville. The first picture on the presentation was of a picnic for the Piedmont Planning District Commission. Ms. Foster stated the PPDC experienced a name change to the CRC back in 2005. Ms. Foster stated that the next photo was of the Council members in front of our old office on High Street. Ms. Foster stated that the next picture is of the Council members at the first Council meeting that was held at the first floor of the Mill Building. The CRC was previously located on the first floor of the Mill Building. The CRC later located to the second floor of

the Mill building. Ms. Foster stated that this photo was taken at the Heartland Building grand opening back in 2005. The CRC donated coffee mugs for this grand opening. These mugs will be available for use at each Council meeting. Ms. Foster stated that the next picture is of the Council members taken outside of the Mill building in 2014. She stated that the final photo was taken back in 2019 of our Council members.

Ms. Foster asked Mr. Fortune to give an update on his experience at the Virginia Rural Leadership Institute. Mr. Fortune stated that he has attended two out of the four sessions. Mr. Fortune stated that he has attended a section in Danville and Tappahannock. There are 30 members of the VRLI this year form a variety of different backgrounds. Mr. Fortune mentioned that the common themes of both sections is how to communicate with a variety of different people from a variety of different backgrounds.

Scoping the Future - Discussion of Innovative/Regional Ideas: There was none.

#### **Old Business:**

#### Staff Monthly Project Reports:

**Update on Regional Emergency Planning Activities:** Mr. Fortune stated that a report was included in the Council packet. The CRC was awarded a new SHSP grant in November 2022 to fund community outreach and preparedness activities related to disaster and emergency preparedness. The CRC executed the grant agreement with VDEM on June 15, 2023. CRC staff are preparing to being work on this project. The current end date of this grant is June 30, 2024.

**Update on Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP) Phase III:** Ms. Foster stated a report was included in the Council packet. Ms. Foster stated that Ms. Jones has reached out to the Extension Offices in Charlotte and Lunenburg County to schedule another Rain Barrel Workshop at the new CRC office location in Keysville. Ms. Jones stated that she has scheduled a Rain Barrel Workshop for August 23<sup>rd</sup> from 4 to 6pm in coordination with the Charlotte County Extension Office. Ms. Foster stated that she also assembled and submitted an Interim Report to DEQ.

**Update on Prince Edward County Access Road Project:** Ms. Foster stated that a report was included in the Council packet. Ms. Foster stated that the contractor, J.R. Caskey, Inc. is continuing to work on the access road. Paving for the road has begun. The CRC is assembling another reimbursement request on the project. The access road project is close to completion.

**Update on Nottoway County Comprehensive Plan Update:** Mr. Fortune stated that a report was included in the Council packet. The Planning Commission approved the language and sent a recommendation to the Board for approval of the Plan at the June 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Board of Supervisors has scheduled a public hearing for July 20<sup>th</sup> to consider the Plan for adoption and solicit public comment.

**Update on Charlotte County Comprehensive Plan Update:** Ms. Jones stated that a report was included in the Council packet. A work session was held on June 27<sup>th</sup>. The CRC reviewed the revised draft Sections IV, V, and the first portion of draft section VI including the revised solar language provided by the Berkley Group. The next work section will be held on July 25th. The group will review revised draft sections V and VI. With time permitting, the group will continue discussions on draft of section VII.

**Update on CRC Affordable Workforce Housing Development Program:** Ms. Jones stated that a report was included in the Council packet. Cardinal Homes delivered and set two of the homes in Crewe for Piedmont Habitat. Piedmont Habitat volunteers are currently working to complete the remaining work on Andrew Drive in Farmville and California Ave in Crewe. All Andrew Drive homes are expected to be completed and closed by the end of July. Smyth Properties' contractor has completed framing work on 120 and 114 S Broad Street buildings. Rough-in plumbing, electrical, and HVAC has also been completed for 120 S Broad Street. The contractor will be installing insulation and drywall over the course of the next few weeks. The Town of Blackstone's first home is 85% complete. The sheetrock, floors, and appliances have been installed in the house. The next two homes are expected to bid out over the course of the next few weeks. Mr. Walker asked if he housing units that Smyth Properties own are rental units. Ms. Jones stated that these housing units are rental units. Mr. Walker asked if the property will be owned by Smyth. Ms. Jones stated that the property will be owned by Smyth. Mr. Hankins started that this property is a mixed-use property that will include a commercial space downstairs and a rental property upstairs. Mr. Matthews stated that the properties are one bedroom, one bathroom units targeting young working professionals.

**Update on GO Virginia Region 3 Entrepreneurship and Innovation Implementation:** Ms. Jones stated that a report was included in the Council packet. CRC staff worked with MBC to review submitted grant match and expenditures for SOVA HUB. A final budget revision was assembled and approved by DHCD. The final reimbursement request has been assembled and submitted to DHCD for final approval. Once approved, SPDC will assemble a close out report and the grant will be closed out.

**Update on Kenbridge and Charlotte County Emergency Supplemental Historic Preservation (EHSP) Fund Projects:** Ms. Jones stated that a report was included in the Council packet. The CRC is assisting the Town of Kenbridge and Charlotte County with grant-funded projects through the Department of Historic Resources to make repairs to historic structures that were damaged by Hurricane/Tropical Storm Michael. Harris and Sons, the contractor hired by the Town of Kenbridge, has completed the remaining painting and carpentry work on the Town Hall building. She stated that only a small portion of the carpentry work was covered by this grant. Ms. Jones stated that she and a representative from DHR completed a final site visit of the property on June 13<sup>th</sup>. The DHR representative stated that the completed work was to their satisfaction. Ms. Jones included pictures of the completed work on the next page. CRC staff are working to complete the final close out report. Once we receive the final invoices and proof of payment, the CRC will submit the close out report and final reimbursement request. Contractors hired by Charlotte County have completed the landscaping, excavation and HVAC work. Charlotte County Staff awarded the bid for Plaster Repairs to Virginia Drywall and Plaster, LLC. The Contractor is expected to begin work in September.

**Update on VATI Grant for Cumberland, Lunenburg and Prince Edward:** Mr. Fortune stated that a report and map was included in the Council packet. The CRC was awarded a grant by DHCD through the Virginia Telecommunication Initiative (VATI) program to provide funding to Kinex Telecom to complete a fiber buildout in part of Cumberland County, all of Prince Edward County, and part of Lunenburg County. James Garrett, Kinex Telecom, has advised that as of July 10th, Kinex and their contractor has completed more than 2,839 passings and about 473 installs for new customers. Mr. Fortune stated that Kinex and their contractors have moved into Lunenburg County to work on laying down middle-mile fiber for unserved areas of the County. Mrs. Garrett has advised that Kinex and their contractor will be coordinating with Verizon and Utiliquest while in Lunenburg County. Kinex Crews continue to work in parts of Prince Edward and Lunenburg Counties where middle-mile fiber is in place to complete installs for new customers. Once middle mile is in place, Kinex plans to move into unserved area of Prince Edward and Cumberland Counties. Mr. Emert asked if anyone has been hooked up. Mr. Stanley stated that there have been several residents hooked up. Mr. Hankins mentioned that a Board of

Supervisors Representative has also been hooked up. Ms. Foster asked Mr. Fortune if the 473 installs are the total hooked up customers. Mr. Fortune confirmed that this is the total installs.

**Update on Drakes Branch SLFRF Projects:** Ms. Foster stated that a report was included in the Council packet. The CRC assisted the Town of Drakes Branch to advertise and request proposals for the new town water metering system. This metering system includes remote road functionalities, antennae/receivers, software, leak detection and billing functionality, training for staff, and the purchase of new/replacement water meters. The Town awarded the project to Fortline. The Contractor, Fortline, has ordered and received the 249 meters. The Town plans to hold a kick-off meeting with the contractor to finalize the workplan with town public works before the installation begins. It is expected the work will take about 30 days to be complete.

**Update on Drakes Branch Building Acquisition Project:** Mr. Fortune stated that report was included in the Council packet. The CRC is assisting the Town with implementation of a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program grant from FEMA through VDEM to fund the acquisition and removal of nine buildings in the Town's Central Business District. These buildings are located within the floodplain and are subject to periodic flooding. The appraisal firm retained by Town, EPR, PC, has developed appraisal reports for all of the affected properties and submitted the reports to the Town. The Town attorney has begun title searches on the affected properties, to determine if any of them have tax/lien or other legal issues. Title searches have been completed on four properties. One property has some judgments attached to it, and has been designated for a tax sale. Title searches on the other three properties turned up no issues. The Town is preparing to begin purchase negotiations with the owners of the three properties with clean titles, and is working on a strategy for the other property.

**Update on Blackstone Armory VBAF Grant:** Mr. Fortune stated that report was included in the Council packet. The CRC is assisting the Town with implementation of a Virginia Brownfields Assistance Fund (VBAF) grant through VEDP to undertake asbestos abatement, underground tank removal, and lead abatement at the Harris Memorial Armory Center in Blackstone. This work is part of a larger planned renovation to convert the Armory into a multi-use facility, which would include job training programs for the hospitality industry. Mr. Fortune stated that the contractors retained for the asbestos abatement – Waco, Inc. – and underground tank removal – Hydrogeo Environmental – have begun work on their respective tasks. Waco Inc. has completed the asbestos abatement work and Hydrogeo Environmental had removed the underground tank. The lead abatement contractor, Waco, Inc., is proceeding with the lead abatement work per their contract with the Town. This work is expected to be completed by the end of July.

**Update on CRC Hazard Mitigation Plan Update:** Mr. Fortune stated that a report was included in the Council packet. Mr. Fortune stated that per the June 12<sup>th</sup> update, CRC staff made final changes to the draft Plan in June based on feedback from VDEM staff. The Plan was sent to FEMA Region 3 on June 30th for their review.

**Update on SEED Innovation Hub Project:** Ms. Jones stated that a report was included in the Council packet. The CRC is assisting the Longwood Real Estate Foundation (REF) in implementation of three grants that were awarded to the REF for the completion of the SEED Innovation Hub. Grants are from the U.S. EDA, the Tobacco Commission, and GO Virginia (GOVA). The Longwood Real Estate Foundation is currently working on preparing documents to submit a mortgage wavier to the EDA. The Covenant of Use component of the project is still being discussed between both parties' legal teams. Ms. McGuire gave a brief background and description of the property. Ms. McGuire stated that the EDA would like to have to control of the entire building that includes student housing and retail space. The property only

makes up about 5% of the retail space. Longwood REF attorney provided language to the EDA noting this. The EDA did not original accept this language. McGuire stated that they are working with the EDA representative to resolve this issue.

**Update on CRC GO Virginia Grant – Development of Business Plan and Strategy for NEW REDO:** Ms. Foster stated that a report was included in the Council packet. Ms. Foster stated the third Working Subcommittee Meeting was held virtually on June 26, 2023. The participants were provided a Draft Infrastructure Assessment by Joe Hines, with Timmons. Participants provided input that will be utilized to update the Assessment. Crystal Morphis, Creative EDC gave an update on the Strategic Plan including the Status of conducting/scheduling interviews. The next CRC REDO Advisory Board will be meeting virtually on July 24, 2023.

**Council Member Comments:** Mr. Hankins praised the CRC and Longwood University for their efforts.

#### **New Business:**

# Staff Reports

**Update on Grant Writing:** Ms. Jones stated a copy of the grant writing report was included in the Council packet. Ms. Jones congratulated the Charlotte County Rescue Squad. She stated that the rescue squad was awarded \$276,200.00 to purchase two ambulances. She stated that only 39 agencies were awarded statewide. She stated that the CRC assisted with this application. Ms. Jones stated that Prince Edward County was notified that they were not awarded the USDOT RAISE Planning Grant to complete a 460 East Interchange Study Planning Grant. The CRC assisted with this application. Ms. Jones stated that the CRC is working with the Town of Victoria and the Town of Kenbridge with a potential application to the Virginia Outdoor Foundation – Preservation Trust Fund to expand an existing trail. Ms. Jones also stated that the CRC assisted four localities - Amelia County, Lunenburg County, the Town of Farmville and the Town of Keysville with pre-applications to the VDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) to fund the construction of pedestrian facilities. Preapplications were due on July 1st. Ms. Jones also stated that the CRC assisted Amelia County (regional app.), the Town of Farmville, and Prince Edward with submitted applications to the VDEM State Homeland Security Program. Mr. Fortune noted that Amelia County is the applicant for a regional application to fund a Tent for mass causality events The CRC also assisted the Drakes Branch Volunteer Fire Department with an application to Firehouse Subs to purchase a rescue strut to help secure overturned vehicles during search and rescue efforts. Mr. Jones asked if we were able to find any funding for Animal Shelters. Ms. Foster stated that we are continuously looking funding for animal shelters. Ms. King mentioned that she sent us an email regarding a solar grant that was shared with her by a constituent. Ms. Foster stated that we will look into this grant program further. Mr. Fortune stated that we will be assisting the Town of Crewe with a planning grant application to DHCD CBDG program.

**EDA Notification** — **Request for EDA Local Technical Assistance Funds:** Ms. Foster stated that the report is included in the Council Packet. Ms. Foster stated as previously noted, the CRC's application for EDA local technical assistance funds has been selected for further consideration for funding. Ms. Foster stated that this does not guarantee final approval of funding just that we moved to the next stage in the review process. The CRC has submitted the request for additional documentation. Ms. Foster stated that she checks in with the EDA on a weekly basis. The EDA is currently waiting on the funding to be appropriated into the correct funding opportunity, so they can allocate it to the program.

Notification of CRC eligibility for Southeast Crescent Regional Commission (SCRC), Local

**Development District (LDD) Grant Funds:** Ms. Foster stated that the letter was included in the Council Packet. CRC staff attended a mandatory webinar regarding the program. She stated that this program could potentially be used as funding to set up the REDO organization. Ms. Foster stated that she would have to look into this funding further.

**Council Member Comments:** There were none.

Commonwealth Intergovernmental Review Process (CIRP): There were no comments.

Other Business: There was none.

**Council Member Comments:** Mr. Vaughan introduced the Mayor of Crewe. Ms. Foster reminded the Council Members and attendees that she will be giving a tour of our office building after the meeting for whomever would like to see.

**Adjournment, Next Meeting:** Mr. Hankins moved and Mr. Vaughan seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 9:50 a.m. The next meeting was set for Wednesday, August 16th, at the CRC's new office located at the Heartland Building in Keysville, Virginia.

**SUBJECT:** Update on Regional Emergency Planning Activities

As you are aware, the CRC was awarded a State Homeland Security program (SHSP) grant in November 2022 to fund community outreach and preparedness activities related to disaster and emergency preparedness. This grant was funded under a FEMA National Priority, Community Preparedness. Consequently, FEMA placed on hold on these funds at the time of award. That hold was released on May 16, 2023.

As you are aware the CRC has received \$2 million in grant funds from Virginia Housing to establish 21 affordable and workforce housing units in the CRC region **over a 48-month period**. CRC staff time on the project is also covered by this grant award.

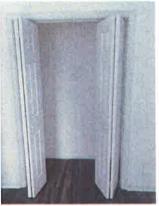
Project: The Affordable Workforce Housing Development Program has established three housing partners: Piedmont Habitat for Humanity, Smyth Properties, and The Town of Blackstone. Piedmont Habitat will be installing 11 modular homes in the Towns of Farmville, Keysville, and Crewe. Smyth Properties will be establishing seven (7) units for lease through adaptive reuse of downtown properties in Kenbridge. The Town of Blackstone and their partner, Southside Outreach, will be building three (3) homes in Blackstone for home ownership.

**Update:** CRC staff are assembling the monthly reimbursement request to Virginia Housing.

- Piedmont Habitat Piedmont's contractor and volunteers are currently working to complete the remaining work on two of the homes on Andrew Drive in Farmville and the two homes on California Ave in Crewe. Two of the houses on Andrew drive have been completed. All the Andrew Drive homes are expected to be completed by the end of August. CRC staff has set up a compliance review with Virginia Housing for all four of the homes on Andrew Drive for August 24<sup>th</sup>. Piedmont Habitat held an open house event on July 28th with future homeowner Zack Kowalski to tour their most recent completed house and learn about Piedmont's plans to help meet the need for additional quality, affordable homeownership opportunities across the region.
- Smyth Properties The contractor has completed the framing, rough in electrical, plumbing, HVAC inspections and Insulation. The drywall for 114 and 120 South Broad in Kenbridge are estimated to begin over the course of the next few weeks.
- Town of Blackstone/ Southside Outreach The first house has been completed and has received the Certificate of Occupancy. Staff from the CRC, the Town of Blackstone, Southside Outreach, and Virginia Housing completed a compliance review of the first home. Pictures of the completed home are on the next page.

**Project:** The CRC is assisting Charlotte County and the Town of Kenbridge with grant administration of the two grant funded projects.

Project Synopsis: Kenbridge Town Hall Repairs project – grant funds will be utilized to repair the Kenbridge Town Hall which was damaged during Hurricane Michael. Charlotte County Courthouse Complex Drainage project – grant funds will be utilized to address moisture issues for the Charlotte Courthouse Complex that flooded and was damaged during Hurricane Michael.

# Project Update:

<u>Kenbridge Town Hall Repairs Project</u> – The contractor, Harris and Sons, has completed the remaining painting and carpentry work on the Town Hall building (only a small portion of the carpentry work will be covered by this grant). CRC staff has assembled and submitted the final reimbursement request and final close out report.

<u>Charlotte County Courthouse Complex Drainage Project</u> – Charlotte County staff awarded the bid for Plaster Repairs to Virginia Drywall and Plaster, LLC. The contractor is expected to begin work in September. The CRC will remain in contact with Charlotte County to see the progression of the project.

\*\*The Emergency Supplemental Historic Preservation Funds (ESHP) were only available through the Department of Historic Resources to localities that suffered historic property damage due to Hurricane Michael. Localities had to be listed in the Hurricane Florence and/or Hurricane Michael Major Disaster Declaration to be eligible for assistance.

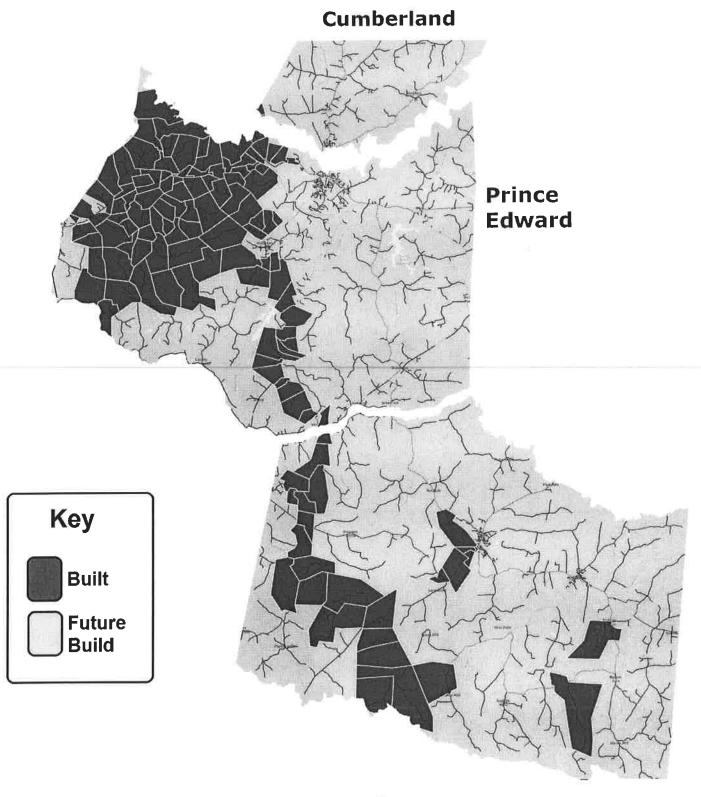
Project: CRC VATI grant for the expansion of broadband in Cumberland, Lunenburg, and Prince Edward Counties. The project involves working with Kinex Telcom, a local internet service provider.

#### **Update:**

- Kinex and their contractors are working in Lunenburg County to lay down middle-mile fiber for unserved areas of the County. James Garrett, Kinex Telecom, has advised that he is coordinating with Verizon Utiliquest while Kinex and the contractor are working in Lunenburg County.
- CRC staff were made aware of a verbal altercation between a crew from GAC (the contractor working for Kinex) and a local resident in Lunenburg County on August 3 regarding right-ofway issues in which deputies from the Sheriff's Department and Lunenburg County staff responded. It was determined that the crew was working within the right-of-way. CRC and Lunenburg County staff discussed the matter with Mr. Garrett, to inform him of the situation and discuss potential remedies to minimize the risk of future incidents.
- Kinex crews continue to work in parts of Prince Edward and Lunenburg Counties where middle-mile fiber is in place to complete installs for new customers.
- Mr. Garrett advised that once middle-mile work is completed in Lunenburg County, Kinex plans to move into unserved areas of Prince Edward and Cumberland Counties.
- As of August 7<sup>th</sup>, a total of 3,721 passings (out of a target of 10,734 total passings) and 508 installs for new customers have been completed.
- Just a reminder, there is a Project Management Team that meets monthly to discuss the project. The team includes local staff, CRC staff, Kinex staff, and DHCD staff. The team meets on the second Friday of every month. The next meeting is scheduled for August 11th.

#### Project:

The CRC is under contract with the Town of Drakes Branch to provide project administration assistance for the expenditure of SLFRF funds to be utilized to complete needed projects in the Town of Drakes Branch. The CRC is providing technical assistance including reporting on the SLFRF funds expended.

#### **Update:**

The CRC assisted the Town to advertise Request Proposals for the new town water metering system. The new water metering system will include: remote read functionalities, antennae/receivers, software, leak detection and billing functionality, training for staff and the purchase of new/replacement water meters.

The Town held a kick-off meeting on July 20, 2023 with the contractor, town employees and the CRC. The Town is investigating the purchase of needed software and purchasing IT equipment for the reading of the meters as well as ordering additional sized meters. Installations of meters will begin in the coming weeks.

It is expected the work will be completed in 30 days (weather permitted).

**SUBJECT:** Update – Drakes Branch Building Acquisition Project

As you may recall, the Town of Drakes Branch has been awarded a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) grant by FEMA through VDEM to fund the acquisition and removal of nine (9) buildings in the Town's Central Business District. These buildings are located within the floodplain and are subject to damage from flood events in the area. The HMGP grant is being matched with a combination of funds from the State and local matching funds from the Town. The CRC is assisting the Town with the implementation of this project.

**Update:** Appraisals have been completed for all affected properties, and the Town Attorney is in the process of conducting title searches on the affected properties to determine if any of them have tax/lien or other legal issues. Title searches have been completed on four properties. One property has some judgements attached to it, and has been designated for a tax sale. CRC staff assisted the Town in getting clarification from VDEM on an issue regarding a potential purchase of that property. Title searches on the other three properties turned up no issues. The Town is currently in negotiations with the owners of the other three properties. The Town Attorney is preparing to begin work on additional title searches in mid-August.

CRC Staff Update - Providing Grant Writing Services to Local Agencies

As per the CRC's ongoing efforts to provide grant writing services for County Public Schools, local government, law enforcement, and 501 (c)(3) organizations in the region, the following activities have taken place since July 11, 2023:

# Status Update

- Curdsville Community Center (Buckingham County): The CRC is working with the group to seek funding opportunities to renovate the community center.
- VDEM State Homeland Security Grant: The CRC assisted Amelia County (regional application), the Town of Farmville, and Prince Edward with applications. Applications were due on July 17, 2023.
- Firehouse Subs: The CRC assisted the Drakes Branch Volunteer Fire Department with an application to purchase a rescue strut to help secure overturned vehicles during search and rescue efforts. Applications are taken quarterly and opened on July 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Town of Blackstone, USDA Rural Development (RD): CRC staff assisted the Town of Blackstone with an application for funds to purchase equipment for the Harris Memorial Armory Center. The Town has selected to withdraw this application.
- DHCD Industrial Revitalization Fund: The CRC has worked with the Farmville Downtown Partnership to discuss a potential application to the IRF grant program.
- DHCD Community Development Block Grant Planning Grant: CRC Staff are assisting the Town of Crewe with a CBDG Planning Grant application for a Downtown Revitalization Project. The application closes on December 30, 2023.
- NPS, African American Civil Rights: The CRC is assisting Cumberland Co. with a potential application to renovate the historic Luther P. Jackson High School.
- VDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP): The CRC assisted Amelia County, Lunenburg County, the Town of Farmville and the Town of Keysville with pre-application submissions to fund the construction of pedestrian sidewalks. Pre-applications were due July 1, 2023. CRC, VDOT, and County staff attended two site visits for Amelia and Lunenburg Counties.

# Awaiting Approval

- Virginia Department of Health, Office of Drinking Water Drinking Water State Revolving
  Fund: The CRC assisted Prince Edward County with a request for funds to develop the Sandy
  River Reservoir to a public drinking water source. The CRC also assisted the Town of
  Charlotte Court House with a request for funds to replace water meters and install isolation
  values. Applications were due by May 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Virginia Main Street, Resurgence Grant: The CRC assisted the Town of Blackstone with a request for funds to start a small business support training services for existing businesses in Blackstone's Historic Business District. Applications were due April 28<sup>th</sup>. The award was anticipated to be announced in July 2023. DHCD staff advised us that they are waiting on the Governor's office to announce the awards.
- CENTRA Health Grant- The CRC assisted the Amelia Emergency Squad with a request for funds to purchase an AED device for one of the ambulances. Applications were due May 1<sup>st</sup>. Funding awards will be made no later than September 31, 2023.
- Prince Edward County Congressionally Directed Spending Request: CRC staff assisted the County with a request for funds to develop the Sandy River Reservoir to a public drinking water source. Requests were due by March 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grant (SAFER): CRC staff assisted Farmville Volunteer Fire Department with a SAFER application. Funds will be used to hire additional personnel. Applications were due by March 17<sup>th</sup>.
- Town of Drakes Branch, Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), American Rescue Plan Act Wastewater Funds: The Town is awaiting approval on its application to DEQ for funds to undertake repairs to the Town's sewer system, to address problems with average flows exceeding acceptable limits. The CRC assisted with this application, which was submitted on December 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Buckingham County, National Park Service Save Americas Treasures Grant Program: The County is awaiting word on its application for funds to complete necessary restoration projects on their Historic County Courthouse. The CRC assisted with this application, which was submitted on December 20<sup>th</sup>. Funding awards were anticipated in Mid-July. There are still not updates on the funding award announcement.
- Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG): CRC staff are awaiting word on when award announcements for the most recent submitted applications. Awards are ongoing until funds are depleted. CRC staff assisted with the following applications:
  - O Victoria Fire and Rescue (VFR) requested funds to replace one of their trucks that has fallen into disrepair.
  - o Prince Edward County Fire and Rescue is requesting funds in a regional application to purchase a thermal imaging camera.
  - o Drakes Branch Fire and Rescue requested funds to purchase a thermal imaging camera and turnout gear.

• Playground Equipment Funding: The CRC is continuing to research funding for a playground equipment.

As you are aware the CRC has been working with the Secretary of Agriculture and Forestry, Matthew Lohr to facilitate discussions on the recruitment of a poultry processor to the region after the closing of the Tyson facilities. A meeting was held in May with poultry farmers, locality representatives as well as state agency representatives. The Secretary provided an update last month on findings and results as well as stating it is now his office's opinion that a AFID Planning Grant for the funding of a Poultry Feasibility Study for the region would be helpful in his offices continued efforts to recruit a poultry processor to the region. This Study would provide more technical information on the poultry industry infrastructure requirements and needs to allow for a more targeted recruitment strategy moving forward. As you are aware the CRC offered our assistance in applying for grant funds to assist in this endeavor. I have been in contact with Bill Scruggs with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) to discuss this grant request and with the assistance of Tony Banks, Senior Assistant Director, Agriculture, Development and Innovation Department, Virginia Farm Bureau Federation a Draft Concept has been put together (attached). It is the intent that this will be a fast-tracked Study with completion in 9 months along with targeted products being reported along the way that will support the continued efforts of recruiting a poultry processor to the region.

The Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund (AFID) Planning Grant may fund up to \$35,000 for a multi-county application. It is estimated that this study will cost \$70,000. The CRC is eligible to be the applicant for the region. However, the AFID Planning Grant requires dollar for dollar match. Therefore, the seven counties will be asked to provide the \$35,000 (\$5,000 per county) matching funds for this request. A request for matching funds will be sent out to all seven counties for approval. Once we have received approval from all seven counties, the CRC will apply for AFID Planning Grant funding for this Study.

At this time, I am looking for feedback from all seven county representatives on the match funding request.

The CRC sent out a request for proposals for Managed IT services for the Commonwealth Regional Council IT equipment.

The CRC received three (3) proposals (attached) from:

- Integrated Technology Group (ITG), Madison Heights, VA
  - o One time infrastructure update \$8,254.44
  - o Managed IT and Software services (Annual) \$13,058.40
- Zachary McKinney Technology, Keysville, VA
  - Managed IT and Software Services (Annual) \$22,050.00
- RGB Technology, Farmville, VA
  - Managed IT services for equipment (Annual) \$4,500

After reviewing all three proposals I would like to recommend approval of the ITG Proposal for \$13,058.40 (Annual) as well as the one-time cost of \$8,254.44.

The ITG proposal was the most comprehensive service package that includes not only managing IT but providing service calls on equipment and a 24 hr. call center for IT issues not included in the other proposals.

While this proposal was not the lowest price it will provide cost savings of \$1,209) for other products the CRC currently utilizes that would no longer be necessary (antivirus and email security). The one-time costs proposed are to bring outdated equipment up-to-date. ITG currently services the Heartland Building Conference room equipment (owned by the Heartland Authority) through a contract with Charlotte County. Charlotte County provided an excellent reference for ITG services.

The CRC approved FY23-24 Budget allowed \$6,000 for Managed IT Services as this was an estimated cost. Therefore, since this recommendation is an increase in the budgeted amount, I am seeking approval to move forward with this contract.
